Brief Biography of Kalon Ngodup Tsering:

Mr. Ngodup Tsering was born on 1 July 1953. He is an alumnus of Punjab University, Chandigarh with a degree in Bachelor of Arts. He was also a former member of the Tibetan Parliament-in-Exile, formerly known as the Tibetan People's Deputies from 1979-1982. He joined the Central Tibetan Administration in 1983, on the post of Deputy Secretary. He was initially posted at the Department of Education. In 1987, he was transferred to the Department of Home on the same post.

From 1991-1995, he served as the Director of the Tibetan Institute of Performing Arts (TIPA). He was also the recipient of the Best Staff among gazette officers in 1995, awarded by a Swiss based Tibetan Association.

In 1996, he was promoted to the post of Secretary and appointed as the new Secretary of the Department of Education. In 1999, he was transferred to the Department of Home of the Central Tibetan Administration as the home secretary.

From 2001-2008, he served as the president and the Director of various Tibetan associations in the United States. He was appointed as the secretary of the Department of Education again in 2012, and then as Kalon in September 2014 under the 14th Kashag led by President Dr. Lobsang Sangay.

LEADERSHIP FOR CLASS Xth STUDENTS

A seven day program on leadership for class X students was organised by department of education at lower TCV, Dharamsala. The program commenced on 27th December, 2017 and concluded on 3rd January, 2018. A total of 257 students accompanied by 27 teachers from all over India and Nepal attended the leadership workshop. The program comprised various topics for leadership development which is crucial in contemporary times and especially vital to larger Tibetan community in exile. Along with leadership topics there were other cocurricular activities such as talent show, extempore speech, educational video and basketball ball match scheduled for the students. The workshop is designed at building an overall understanding on Leadership Skills and Qualities and development of Leaders for future Tibetan community.

Secular Ethics Workshop for School Teachers at Sarah, Dharamsala

The Department of Education, CTA in collaboration with Emory University and Library of Tibetan Works and Archives organized a four-day workshop on Secular ethics for Tibetan school teachers in Sarah, Dharamsala. The workshop commenced from 11th Dec to 14th Dec 2017.

Chief Guest, Secretary Karma Singey of Department of Education welcomed the timely initiative led by the Department. "We have had multiple discussions on secular ethics at various levels over the years. The need of the hour was a synergized efforts from all departments who can affect change in this regard. This initiative is hence very encouraging and we look forward to seeing concrete plans as a result of the workshop.

He appealed the teachers to gather a sound understanding of the secular ethics curriculum In order to enable thorough implementation in schools.

Addressing the inaugural ceremony, Geshe Lhakdor, Director of Library of Tibetan Works and Archives and Chairman of the Education Council said that secular ethics is an enduring idea with ancient roots. "Ancient Philosopher Aristotle, Plato and Socrates had articulated

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ethics and moral philosophy and contributed extensive literature in this field. If one was to study this field from a research perspective, there is a great deal of knowledge, discussions and debate recorded from the time of Aristotle."

He underlined that His Holiness the Dalai Lama's vision for secular ethics was very practical and relates to our common sense. "His Holiness' idea of secular ethics comes from a deep well of knowledge and far-sighted vision focused on humanity's wellbeing. "Although we are divided by our different concepts of morality, values and belief in different faith, his moral vision is one that includes all human beings: believers, non-believers and those who are anti-religion.

The four-day workshop is being funded by DeichoeFrasi Charitable Trust, UK and Department of Finance, CTA.

Secular Ethics Workshop at Bylakuppe

A two day talk cum workshop on Secular Ethics was organized by Department of Education in collaboration with Sera Je Secondary School, Bylakuppe. The workshop commenced on 22nd December 2017 and concluded on 23rd December 2017.

Academic Section Modern Section Participation in 44th JNNSMEE National Level Science Exhibition



The Department of Education is pleased to announce the participation of two Tibetan schools namely Tibetan Homes School Mussoorie and SOS Bylakuppe in the 44rd Jawaharlal Nehru National Science, Mathematics and Environment Exhibition being organized by NCERT at RCVP Noronha Academy of Administration and Management, Bhopal from 10th to 16th November 2017. The JNNSMEE actually is a conducting series of activity and exhibitions at zonal, district, regional, state level and finally selecting convincing projects to be presented at the National Level Exhibition.

The Department of Education after a continuous effort could seek approval from NCERT for direct participation of Tibetan schools in the National Level Exhibition as one entity titled Central Tibetan Administration, CTA School. Out of various exhibition held at Tibetan school level science exhibit, two models were selected for presentation at the 44th JNNSMEE National Level Exhibition at Bhopal.

Two students named Tenzin Yarphel accompanied by mentor Mr. Tenzin Nuden from THF Mussoorie and Thindup Gurung mentored by Ms. Dickey and Mr. Nyima Damdul from SOS Bylakuppe represented the CTA team at the National Level Exhibition with models on Pedaling washing machine and Comparative study on the effect of organic and chemical fertilizer on Earthworm. The

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primary objective of the exhibition is to provide forum for children to pursue their natural curiosity, creativity, innovation and inventiveness and sensitivity to local as well as global problems. It is also to encourage students to aspire for scientific study in future course of time. This program is funded by USAID through The Tibet Fund.

Entrepreneurship Awareness Program at South Zone Schools

One day program on Entrepreneurship awareness was held at 5 Tibetan Schools in the South Indian Tibetan Settlements namely, the Central School for Tibetans in Gurupura, Bylakuppe, Kollegal, Mundgod and the SOS Tibetan Children's Village School in Bylakuppe. A total of 629 students attended the awareness program including all the schools. As part of DOE initiative TED awareness program has been successfully implemented in all south zone schools.

Entrepreneurship Awareness and Entrepreneurship Education are the foundations for a developing community and the Tibetan community in particular should make Entrepreneurship its building blocks for its future towards sustainable development. It is also to encourage the students in future to pursue entrepreneurship as profession apart from conventional professions.

Education Department Holds Talk Series on Secular Ethics

Dharamsala: Geshe Yeshi Gyaltsen, lecturer on Secular Ethics of the Bangalore-based Dalai Lama Institute for Higher Education gave series of talk on Secular Ethics in and around Dharamsala from 17 to 24 October 2017.

Eleven trainees and teachers of the DoE's Montessori Training at Sherab Gatsel Lobling were especially given two half-day talks on Secular ethics on 17 and 18 October. The talks were even attended by Ngodup Tenpa, Education Officer from the Education Department. During the talks, Geshe Yeshi Gyaltsen rationally informed the trainees with real life examples about the importance of values and compassionate heart, as well as the ways to cultivate these values. For the holistic development of the children, he even encouraged the trainees, who are all females, to be more compassionate and empathetic towards children as qualified teachers as well as mothers in near future, so that the children grow up healthy physically, mentally and emotionally.

Then the another talk was given to around 250 students and staff including the principal at the College for Higher Tibetan Studies, Sarah on 19 October and to 25 students and five staff including the principal at the Norbulingka Institute on 20 October. During these talks, Geshe Yeshi Gyaltsen talked about the ethics related specifically to students as well as to all the human beings in general.

The last talk in Dharamsala was given to 240 nuns of Dolma Ling Nunnery and Institute on 24 October. The talk was also joined by other 25 nuns from seven different nunneries within India and from Nepal, as they are here to participate in the Jang Philosophical debate congregation. (এছম'ন্যুব্ ক্রিমা)

All the talks series were concluded with question and answer sessions, during which several doubts of the students were cleared with detailed answers. As overwhelming response received from the students in Mangalore and Bangalore last month, the students here in Dharamsala have also shown and expressed deep appreciation about the programme. Discussions during and after the talk clearly showed their interest in developing such inner values themselves.

Pre Primary Teacher Workshop

The Department of Education has organized AMI Preprimary Assistant course for Pre Primary Trainees and Teachers at Sherab Gatsel Lobling School, Dharamsala from 4th December 2017 to 15th December 2017. A total number of 29 participants (28 female & 1 male) attended the workshop. Resource Person Ms. Lhamo Pemba, Association Montessori International (AMI) Primary Trainer taught on the various topics during the 10 days'
